### **Meditation and Reflection on his precious word**

*Let us each day walk through the sufferings of Christ. Christ said very little when he was betrayed. He did not attempt to defend himself, but "humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross" Phil 2:8*

**"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me:" Matthew 27:46 & Mark 15:34**

The weight of the sin of the world has been placed on Christ and in this moment, he is completely abandoned by God, the Father. Sin separates us from the holy. Christ experienced that for us. The intimate relationship with the God the Father he had his entire life was lost. The words used to convey the devastation of this abandonment is another fulfillment of Scripture in the language from Psalm 22.

### **A Spiritual Practice for Maundy Thursday**

#### **Handwashing**

*Prepare a pitcher of water, a bowl, and towels. Prayerfully pour water over each hand or allow a family member to do so. As you do so reflect on the grace and love of Jesus Christ poured out in your life. Conclude with this prayer: O God, your love is embodied in Jesus Christ, who washed disciples' feet on the night of his betrayal. Wash us from the stain of sin, so that, in hours of danger, we may not fail, but follow your Son through every trial, and praise him always as Lord and Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen*
